2. Goals:

Involve the students in management and development of the institution.

Give students hands on experience and thereby prepare them better for taking up jobs in future.

To develop dignity of labour among students

To help financially economically weaker students

To build work culture among students

3. The Context:

Majority of student coming to our college are from rural area. It is observed that due to financial weakness, it is difficult for them to pursue a programme. Hence, the said practice addresses this issue to enable students to continue their education. Objective of the scheme is to develop a student as a multifaceted personality with academic excellence and a commitment to an egalitarian society. It inculcates in the student the idea that no work is big or small and develops a work culture with the right aptitude.

4. The Practice:

Earn and learn scheme is a unique feature of Rayat Shikshan Sanstha founded by Dr. Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil. Economically needy students enrolled under the scheme. They are given the office work, technical work and field work. However when the distribution of work is given it is seen that all students get equal opportunity to get all different kinds of work and that each student gets eighty percent of technical work and twenty percent of fieldwork. Office work includes working at the Library or any other office of the college for which they are paid the remuneration.

5. Evidence of Success:

It has been functioning quite successfully for the last so many years. Based on the evolution of data collection, it has been found that the practice has turned out to be a success. During academic year the amount Rs. 335760/- has been utilized for paying remuneration to 52 needy students who learnt while they earned.

6. Problems encountered and resources:

Students demand for the said practice is more. To meet their demands, college requires additional fund.

1. Title of the Practice: Green Campus Initiative:

2. Goals:

To increase environmental awareness among students, staff of the college and among population in the vicinity of the college.

- To minimize the environmental pollution in and around campus.
- To use renewable energy resources particularly solar energy.
- To study and maintain biodiversity of college campus.
- To support and implement 'Swach Bharat Aabhiyan.

3. The Context:

Clean environment is the basic necessity for human being for health and efficiency. Mostly limited availability of public transport compelled increased use of personal vehicles which is one of the reasons to increase pollution in and around campus. Chemical experimentation in the college laboratories emits green house gases, it adds to the environmental pollution. Solar energy can be the potential replacement for the conventional electricity.

4. The Practice:

Energy audit of consumption of electricity in the college conducted during the academic 2016-2017 by Aditi Engineering services, Nashik. The objective of audit is to identify energy saving and conservation opportunity with electrical network load study, measurement and to recommend action plan with saving and financial calculation for implementation to materialize energy saving and improvement.

The college consulted to Dr. P.G. Saptarshi, Eminent Professor, Department of Environmental Science, S.P. Pune University, Pune for the green audit during the academic year 2016-17. The objective of the green audit is to promote the Environment Management and Conservation in the college campus and introduce and aware students to real concerns of environment and its sustainability. To create awareness among students, staff and society about botanical name, common name, plant family and significance of plants we have undertaken a program to label the plants of college campus.

Department of Zoology introduced vermin composting unit in campus from last two years. The objective is to create awareness of the waste management and reduce organic food waste from the college campus. Recharge pits are constructed in college campus for harvesting the surface rain water and it is beneficial for bore well.

The use of renewable energy like solar energy is done at college hostels of both Boys' and Girls'. College has solar light along the road side of campus. Besides the use of solar energy at college hostels, the college plans to make use of solar energy to light up the area around the college play ground where citizens of the city come to take morning and evening walk.

5. Evidence of Success:

Electricity failure will not affect the availability of light during the period of power cut by MSEB at night time especially along road side of campus.

Electric bills are reduced.

All the departments and students are aware about the need for environmental protection at a general level.

It was also observed that a number of best practices such as maintaining potted plants, introducing plastic free zone, no vehicle day etc. are followed in the campus.

Problem of disposal of organic food is solved by vermin composting unit.

Continuous water supply is available even during the period of water scarcity.

6. Problems encountered and resources:

These activities have been initiated based on the available funds and those could be further enhanced upon receiving funding for the same.
