- Students, whose interests fall under arts and literature such as language subjects are in Hindi, English, History, Psychology, Philosophy, Political Science, Home Science, etc, should join this course.
- After this course, you can choose your favorite subject from the option of many available subjects, and take your career to a good height.
- You can guess the potential of the art course from the fact that many of the students who become IAS and IPS after qualifying UPSC are from the arts background.

Eligibility for IA course:-

- Eligibility Criteria are very easy for Intermediate of Arts.
- In many colleges and schools, you can get admission based on your 10th mark directly.
- Your 10th or Matriculation should be from any recognized board, State Board, or CBSE Board.
- It means you can get admission in most of the colleges with your 10th mark; the minimum percentage should be 33%.
- But many colleges demand a high percentage on the 10th for admission in this course. For example, some such colleges are DU colleges.

Admission Procedure for Intermediate of Arts:-

- Most of the colleges provide you admission in the IA course based on your 10th mark.
- But some top colleges can even conduct a personal interview before admission.
- Tuition Fees for Intermediate of Arts course
- The state government, central government or some Trusts owns most of the colleges and schools for this course, so the tuition fees are negligible.
- In most of the states, the state board or colleges only charge exam fees to their students.
- But in Private colleges or schools, students have to pay tuition fees also, which is ranging from 1000 per month to even 5000 per month in some cases.

Arts Stream Subjects Explained:-

1. History:-

- One of the traditional Arts stream subjects, History teaches the evolution of human civilization from prehistory to the present times.
- It also covers the major historical events, lays emphasis on the art and architecture such as the history of Indian Art, and imparts knowledge on the works of great personalities of the world.
- The curriculum of the subject takes you on a journey of mankind and develops your insight into the future of development.
- On pursuing courses like BA History, MA History, etc. you will gain knowledge pertaining to Ancient History, Medieval History, Modern History, Political History, Cultures of the World, Language and Literature, amongst others. Graduates in History can enter into professions like Teaching, Research, Conservation Management, Archaeology, Civil Services, Public Administration, Travel and Tourism and Media Studies.
- Also, you will easily find History in the syllabus of BA courses after 12th Arts.

2. Economics:-

- Economics studies the processes or systems by which goods and services are produced, sold and bought at a larger level (Macroeconomics) and at the smaller individual level (Microeconomics).
- The subject deals with the behavior and interactions of economic agents and how various economies work.

- From Business and Managerial Economics to Financial and Agricultural Economics, there are scores of domains you can specialize in.
- Further, after pursuing courses like BSc Economics, BA Economics, etc. you can work in sectors like Banking, Insurance, Real Estate, Service and Manufacturing Firms, Consulting, Non-profit Organizations, and Government Agencies and build a successful career in Economics!

3. Geography:-

- Further, the Political Science syllabus helps individuals discover a wide spectrum of a potential career in Political Science such as political office holders, law firms, law enforcement agencies, political organization, field research firms and many more.

5. English:-

- English, which is one of the compulsory Arts stream subjects, offers a well-structured syllabus covering various facets of the subject.
- Apart from laying emphasis on improving the writing and speaking skills, the curriculum also focuses on reading skills through English literature.
- The class 11th and 12th level English builds a strong foundation for English Literature courses, exams like IELTS, TOEFL, English Olympiad exam, etc.

6. Psychology:-

14. Legal Studies:-

- Areas of work in Media Studies include Television, Newspaper, Radio, Cinema,
 Video, Digital Media, Journalism, Writing and Publishing.

16. Entrepreneurship:-

- Entrepreneurship is a subject that resembles Business Studies but offers basic insights and understanding into the principles of developing, organizing and managing a business venture.
- Apart from equipping with the skills of handling the risks associated with the startups, Entrepreneurship Development Programs also enhance the other career skills.

- When we talk about the current education system in India then apart from the state boards, the students can study Arts stream subjects from 3 major national-level education boards namely, Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), Indian Certificate of Secondary Education (ICSE), and International Baccalaureate (IB).
- Students are allowed to choose a board that best suits them and the choice is made on the basis of the difficulty level associated with each board, besides the aptitude of the students.
- IB is the toughest board as it lays emphasis on the practical aspects of learning, followed by the ICSE board.
- CBSE board is quite popular and falls under the Union Government of India, and the difficulty level is quite moderate.
- Every state in the country has its own education board and MOI in case of institutions affiliated to such boards are English and Regional Languages.

- Selected candidates are given preliminary training in all the areas of physical fitness and academics for a period of 3 years at NDA's central academy.
- The first 2.5 years will consist of common training for all candidates, after which the candidate will be bestowed upon a degree from JNU Delhi.
- As for the stipend, you could receive a total of INR 21,000 per month. After training, the sum would be bumped up to INR 55,000.

2) SSC Combined Higher Secondary Level (CHSL):-

- You must have a knack for languages and a large understanding of the language used for the speeches.

B) Press Conference Briefings:-

- You will have to attend the press conferences accompanying the minister of the senior officer so that you note down all the important points to be noted.
- You will be responsible for the press releases of your minister or officer.

C) Assisting the Minister or Officer:-

10) State Public Service Commission (PSC) Examination for Clerical Staff / Assistants
